Kris Tschetter



Kris Tschetter was raised in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. She graduated from Texas Christian University in 1987 and joined the LPGA tour in 1988. Kris and Billy Andrade teamed up to win the JC Penney Mixed Team Classic in 1991, and Kris won the Northgate Computer Classic in 1992. She finished 2nd in two majors; the 1996 U.S. Open to Annika Sorenstam and the 1997 Nabisco Dinah Shore to Betsy King. Kris has earned nearly \$3 million dollars in prize money in her career and her 8-under-par 29 still stands as a British open 9 hole record.

Kris received the Heather Farr award in 2000 after coming back from her first of many hip surgeries, and in 2002 she was named one of 10 outstanding young Americans presented by the United States Junior Chamber. She is in the South Dakota Sports Hall of Fame, the South Dakota Golf Hall of Fame and the Texas Christian University Hall of Fame.

Kris now plays on the Legends tour. She won the Walgreens Classic in 2015 and helped the US team retain the Handa Cup that same year.

Tschetter's heartwarming account of her 15-year friendship with Ben Hogan, "Mr. Hogan, The Man I Knew," has rave reviews from fans and critics alike. She has two daughters and resides in Warrenton, Virginia.

Before teaching golf became her career, Julie played professionally on the Future's, European, Asian and LPGA Tour, winning 12 tournaments worldwide. In addition to her outstanding playing credentials, she excels at instructing golf.

- She has been twice voted by her peers as LPGA Southeast Section Teacher of the Year

Julie has shown leadership in the golf industry by serving as an LPGA National Evaluator and instructor for LPGA Practical Teaching Workshops. In addition to being Honorary Chair of the Julie Cole Charity Golf Classic, she also serves on the Board of Directors for the First Tee of Charlotte.

Pat McGowan



Following a successful 15-year career (1978-1992) as a PGA Tour player, Pat joined Pine Needles Lodge & Golf Club as the director of instruction. McGowan taught alongside LPGA Charter Member, Peggy Kirk Bell, at her world renowned Ladies Golfaris.

Peggy Kirk Bell is being inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2019. The ceremony is to be held at Pebble Beach, the site of the 2019 Men's U.S. Open Championship.
